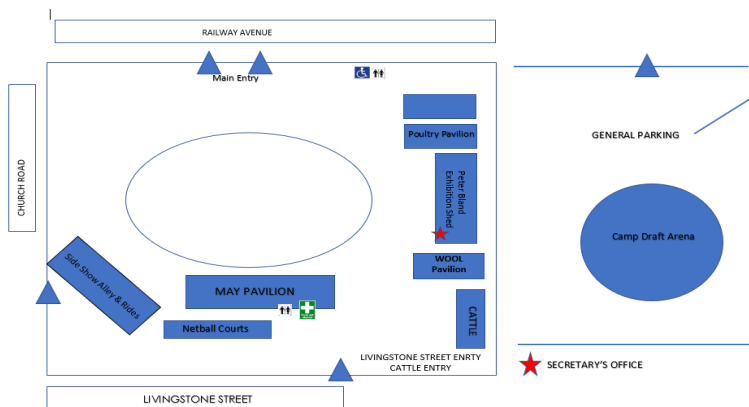

CHEQUES WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED FOR LATE ENTRIES.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Entries must be lodged with the Secretary by Mon 20th November 2023. All fees must accompany entries.
2. All exhibits must be the bona fide property of, and all produce made or grown by the exhibitor, who must make a statutory declaration on immediate demand, if required. A bona fide lessee of any animal will be regarded as the owner if the agreement to lease in writing is produced on demand.
3. A special prize may be awarded in any class should the Judge deem it advisable.
4. All Exhibits in Dairy Cow Section are to be handled to lead and to be led into the ring to be judged if requested.
5. No bull over 12 months old is to be led without ring & staff.
6. Judges' attention to be called to ages of stock, and owners may be called to make a statutory declaration as to age or ownership. **Ages of Dairy Cattle and Horses to date from 1st July and 1st August respectively.**
7. The judge may award a 2nd or 3rd prize instead of a 1st or may withhold a prize altogether where the exhibit is not considered of sufficient merit.
8. Should any exhibit having gained a prize be disqualified, the next one on the list does not necessarily obtain the prize. The committee, with or without the advice of the judges, shall decide the question.
9. Further to any penalties which may be imposed, the Society may withhold any prize when misstatements have erroneously or fraudulently been made regarding any exhibit, and any exhibit making fraudulent statements will be debarred from again exhibiting, and, if a member, be expelled from the Society
10. All persons exhibiting shall accept the decision of the judges appointed by the Society, and in the case of protests the decision of the committee shall be

accepted as final and without appeal, except by appeal to the Victorian Agricultural Shows Ltd.

11. All protests against awards must be lodged with the Secretary on the ground up until 6.00pm on Show Day, together with \$50.00, which shall be forfeited if after due consideration by the Protest Committee if the protest is unfounded or frivolous.

12. The Society will not hold itself responsible for exhibits, but every care will be taken of same.

13. No exhibit shall be packed or removed from exhibit shed before 3 pm

14. No exhibitor, or persons, will be allowed to accompany the Judges on their round of inspection on Show Day, except the steward appointed by the committee.

15. Entries will only be accepted provided the exhibitors abide by the rules and regulations of the Society.

16. The stewards have power to disqualify any insolent exhibitors.

17. In case of dispute as to the construction of any of the regulations on the prize list, the same shall be determined by the committee of the Society, whose decision is final.

18. The committee reserves the right to substitute trophies or goods for cash prizes in any section.

19. Day Tickets are not transferable and must be produced at the gates. Members must be financial members.

20. The Society does not hold itself responsible for anything occasioned by printers' errors in this catalogue, and entries are made and received on these conditions.

21. All machinery in motion shall be securely fenced or be in such a position or of such construction so as to be safe as it would be if it were securely fenced. Chainsaws must not be working.

22. Applications must be made for sideshows and stand space at least seven days prior to the Show. All approved sideshows will be admitted at the owners' risk and no refunds will be granted by the Society. All fees must be paid before the space is allocated.

23. The Society strictly reserves the right to conduct an amplified broadcast. No other form of amplifier mechanism will be permitted to operate from sideshows or other exhibitors.

24. Where the Society has made rules and regulations and some appear in the minute book, but not on this list, they shall be binding on any exhibitor.

25. All exhibits in Fruit & Vegetable and Horticulture Sections (except decorative classes), must be grown by the exhibitor.

26. The Society reserves the right to refuse admittance to, or to remove any animal that may be, or reasonably be expected to be, diseased or dangerous, or likely to prejudice the interests of the Show.

27. All persons connected with or engaged in any of the activities in the arena, and other departments, do so at their own risk.

28. The committee may punish or otherwise penalize any person, competitor,

exhibitor, stand holder, organization, or other body whose conduct in the opinion of the committee is discreditable or injurious to the interests of the Society, or who fails to comply with any rules governing any Show or exhibition conducted by the Society, or disregard or fails to observe any direction or decision of any official or judge appointed by the Society. The procedures to be followed when disciplinary action is taken, are those laid down under VAS Ltd constitution. (Disqualification, Suspensions and Appeals.)

29. LOCAL – Principal place of residence in the Yarram District.

30. The Exhibitor Livestock cover of 20cents per entry is a one day or Show period Public Risk Policy for exhibitors of livestock and gives cover from time of entry to grounds until they leave but does not include transit cover.

31. Where the Society has made rules and regulations and some appear in the minute book, but not on this list, they shall be binding on any exhibitor.

32. All animals which are NOT entered as exhibitors/ competitors at a Show are not covered by Show Society Insurance and are therefore the liability of the owner for any accident which may occur on the Society's grounds.

33. ALL HORSE EVENT COMPETITORS MUST WEAR APPROVED SAFETY HELMETS AND FOOTWEAR IN COMPLIANCE WITH CURRENT AUSTRALIAN, EUROPEAN AND AMERICAN STANDARDS.

THIS RULE APPLIES TO ALL RIDERS, NOT JUST UNDERAGE COMPETITORS.

34. Mobile phones NOT to be carried by any competitors during ring events.

35. All horse and cattle entrants are responsible for the removal of their animal(s) excretion. May incur a \$300 fine if not compliant.

•250g sultanas • 250g chopped raisins • 250g currants • 125g chopped mixed peel • 90g chopped red glace cherries • 90g chopped blanched almonds • 1/3 cup sherry or brandy • 250g plain flour • 60g self-raising flour • 1/4 teaspoon grated nutmeg • 1/2 teaspoon ground ginger • 1/2 teaspoon ground cloves • 250g butter • 250g soft brown sugar • 1/2 teaspoon lemon essence OR finely grated lemon rind • 1/2 teaspoon almond essence • 1/2 teaspoon vanilla essence • 4 large eggs

Method

Cut the fruit & almonds into 3-4 pieces and mix together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with the sherry or brandy. Cover and leave for at least 1 hour, but preferably overnight.

Sift together the flours and spices. Cream together the butter and sugar with the essences. Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition, and then alternately add the fruit and flour mixtures. Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon. Place the mixture into a prepared tin 20 cm square, straight sided, square cornered tin and bake in a slow oven for approximately 3½ - 4 hours. Allow the cake to cool in the tin.

Method

1. Preheat the oven to 180C (160C fan), Grease a 23cm (9 inch) round cake tin and line with baking paper.
2. Sift the dry ingredients together into a bowl. In a separate bowl, beat the eggs and oil, then add to the dry ingredients. Mix well then add the carrots, crushed pineapple and pecans. Mix to form a smooth batter and pour into the cake tin.
3. Bake for approximately 90 - 100 minutes.
4. Remove from the oven and allow to cool for 10 minutes in the tin on a wire rack. Upend and allow to cool on the wire rack.
